







Chatting about the washing

What you can do

Load the washing, hang it out and collect it

- Sort the washing, looking at who it belongs to, what the patterns and colours are
- Make a mini clothes line with pegs for dolls clothes or paper cut out clothes
- Make a pretend washing machine from a box and wash cloths, dolls clothes and socks
- Hang paintings on the washing line to dry

What you can talk about

- What the clothes are like: Talk about sizes, patterns, colours
- Parts of the clothes:
 sleeves, cuffs, collars,
 arms, legs, buttons, zips,
 poppers, hoods, pockets
- Who the clothes belong to
- When you might wear the clothes: hot days, cold days, winter, summer, to parties, weddings
- Where you wear the clothes: on the beach, in the garden, in bed, to a party, at the swimming pool

Language for thinking: compare the sizes of clothes; chat about your favourite clothes using words such as 'like, love, prefer, choose'

Make believe:
pretend to do the
washing for the
dolls/teddies – talk
about the sequence:
first, then, next
